



# OUTPOURING

**SUNDAY Study- January 11, 2026**

**TITLE: The OUTPOURING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT**

**Definition: Impact- "The action of a powerful contact upon another"**

**Foundational Scripture(s) ACTS 2:15— AMPC.-For these men are not drunk, as you imagine, for it is [only] the third hour (about 9:00 a.m.) of the day;**

## **KEY TEACHING POINTS:**

- God confirms the outpouring first through Christ in **Acts 2:15**, we see they were "controlled" by the Holy Spirit.
- **John 3:34- KJV-** For he whom God hath sent speaketh the words of God: for God giveth not the Spirit by measure unto him. God sent the Holy Spirit and gave Him the Spirit without measure which will be poured out on you.
- God gave Jesus authority on the earth with this outpour. When it's poured on you- you walk in this same authority over **ALL** things. Jesus is the head, we are the body, Christ in you, the hope of glory. This power and authority is in every believer.
- The outpouring is about souls. **John 3:35-36-AMPC.**- The Father loves the Son and has given (entrusted, committed) everything into His hand. Vs. 36 -And he who believes in (has faith in, clings to, relies on) the Son has (now possesses) eternal life. But whoever disobeys (is unbelieving toward, refuses to trust in, disregards, is not subject to) the Son will never see (experience) life, but [instead] the wrath of God abides on him. [God's displeasure remains on him; His indignation hangs over him continually.]
- Those that believe, receive life- **ZOE eternal life.** Jesus is on his way back and we need to get as many people saved as possible.
- Before Jesus returns He must pour out his spirit on all flesh.
- **Ephesians 4:30- AMPC.**-And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God [do not offend or vex or sadden Him], by Whom you were sealed (marked, branded as God's own, secured) for the day of redemption (of final deliverance through Christ from evil and the consequences of sin).
- There are many ways we can grieve the Holy Spirit, offend or vex Him, That is one of the reasons we need **His outpouring** on our lives, to help us be more like him, and not offend him, and cause Him not to "pour out."
- The words we speak are spiritual containers so we must guard what we say to others because our words can change things in the realm of the spirit both good, and bad.
- What is our part in this season where the Holy Spirit will "pour out?"- **Vs. 32** says, ampc.- And become useful and helpful and kind to one another, tenderhearted (compassionate, understanding, loving-hearted), forgiving one another [readily and freely], as God in Christ.
